### 2. External Microphone: For Crisp, Clear Audio

The number one giveaway of an amateur video is poor audio quality. An external microphone will drastically improve your sound by focusing on your voice and reducing distracting wind and engine noise.

- Wireless Recommendation (Most Versatile): DJI Mic 2 or Rode Wireless GO II These wireless systems are fantastic. Clip the small transmitter onto your shirt (or the captain's), and the receiver plugs directly into your phone's charging port (be sure to get the correct version for iPhone Lightning or USB-C). This allows you to move freely while maintaining perfect audio. They come with "deadcat" windscreens, which are essential for filming on the water.
